## Staying Smart About Cyber Security

Up to 500,000 visitors from all over the world are expected to travel to Brazil for the 2016 Summer Olympic Games. Surges in international travel and high concentrations of people make large scale events like this ripe for cyber activity. Businesses sponsoring, volunteering, or simply visiting the games may be vulnerable to equipment theft, sensitive data breaches, computer hacking, employee error, and more.



Business travelers should always take extra precautions to guard their cyber presence. Following are some helpful considerations for protecting yourself, your identity, and your data.

### BEFORE

- Make your cyber footprint as small as possible by leaving all unnecessary devices at home.
- Backup all devices and leave your encrypted backups in a secure location at home or in the office.
- Update your anti-virus software and ensure firewall and encryption is enabled at all times.
- Turn off remote connectivity and Bluetooth discovery.
- Change all of your PINS and passwords prior to leaving.
- Alert your employer of your travel plans so they can monitor for any out of the ordinary activity related to your accounts.
- Alert your banks and credit card companies of your travel plans and request heightened monitoring when possible.

### DURING

- Limit the use of devices in public places and keep devices out of sight when not in use.
- Try to keep devices powered off and securely stored in your hotel safe whenever possible.
- Do not use any devices that are not yours, let someone else use your device, or connect a foreign device into your device.
- Avoid prolonged sessions on public Wi-Fi networks in places like hotels, airports, coffee shops, etc. Always use a VPN to reduce unsecure transmissions of your communications.
- Do not open or download any links that look suspicious or unfamiliar.
- Use an RFID-blocking wallet for any contactless credit/debit cards, key fobs, or smart cards that make wireless payments.
- Ensure that your devices require a password immediately upon powering on or returning from sleep/hibernate mode.

### AFTER

- Change all of your PINS and passwords upon your return.
- Consider utilizing identity theft monitoring for a period of time upon your return for additional protection.
